

There is bound to be extensive TV coverage of the Coronation Ceremony itself, plus the concert at Windsor Castle the following evening, which will manage to elbow off some of those staples of the schedules, such as quiz and antiques shows. If you're not looking for a dream house in Fuengirola, seeking help to fix Aunt Mabel's porcelain vase, some busybody is popping round to sort your life out.

Now, having been brought up in my youth on a diet of Top of the Form, Ask the Family and Mastermind in my youth I am not totally averse to quiz shows. I even managed to get a question right once, watching a Portuguese version of "Who Wants to be a Millionaire," guessing correctly that Jose Mourinho wasn't the first man on the moon – he might have aspirations, but he's not got there yet!

However, the extent to which quiz shows dominate was brought home to me recently. One wet afternoon I had settled down a bit earlier than normal, only to be startled out of my reverie, by Ross Kemp's menacing tones demanding to know whether something was a Truth or a Lie. and this was before "Pointless!" ITV is no better with episodes of "Tipping Point" and "The Chase" every weekday afternoon. Then of course there are always celebrity versions for the weekend, with balls to catch and wheels to rotate.

I suppose these types of programme are cheap to make, and even easier to repeat; not everyone readily recalls Tuvalu when searching for names of obscure nations in the Pacific. Having done a bit of research Rather frighteningly, there have been over 1500 episodes of "Pointless" since 2009, not counting celebrity editions.

Still on the subject of TV, I suspect non-sports fans would have been delighted with the recent dramatically shortened version of "Match of the Day." On this form the BBC could fit an entire World Cup into an afternoon, leaving plenty of time to fit in a new cookery series – "Celebrity Soup" hasn't been tried yet.

MINUTES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 7 FEBRUARY 2023

ATTENDANCE Cllrs, Dolley, Bunkum, Warne, Ley, Johnson, Moore and Floyd.

APOLOGIES None.

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST None.

PUBLIC FORUM There were no members of the public present.

MINUTES

The minutes of 3 January 2023 Council meeting were accepted unanimously.

MATTERS ARISING

Playing Field

a) The Chairman informed the Council that after various enquiries regarding safety inspections of play equipment the most attractive candidate was ROSPA who would carry out an annual inspection for some £100. The Council resolved to employ ROSPA in the future.

b) Councillor Johnson reported that the Playing Field Support Group (PFSG) had applied for a grant of £6,500 and this together with funds already held would largely meet an order to Kompan Ltd for new equipment, leaving a shortfall of some £200 which would be raised within the Village. Thereafter it was assumed that the PFSG would become dormant.

Mayor For Cornwall

Four Councillors arranged to attend the public meeting at Liskeard to gather more information regarding the proposal for a Mayor for Cornwall.

PLANNING APPLICATION None.

BLOCKAGE OF TRACK

The Council accepted they could take no action regarding the blockage of the track leading down the hill towards Clapper bridge because it was on private land.

DEBRIS ON THE ROAD IN BARTON MEADOW

The Council requested the Clerk to report to Cornwall Highways the mud on the road in Barton Meadow.

FINANCE

The Council agreed the following payment; £24.99 to Mrs C. Hoskin for weed killer.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

The Chairman thanked Councillor Bunkum for cutting the hedge at the playing field at no cost to the parish.

The Council agreed to request a visit from Tamar Bridge Tolls group to learn of proposed objections to continued tolls.

Councillor Johnson volunteered to represent the Council in the future on the friends of St Odulph's support group.

The Council considered, that the sign on the playing field gate stating that children must be supervised would in no manner deter teenagers from using the field and hence did not require alteration.

PUBLIC FORUM There were three members of the public present.

MINUTES

The minutes of 7 February 2023 Council meeting were accepted unanimously.

MATTERS ARISING

Playing Field

a) Councillor Johnson reported that the Playing Field Support Group (PFSG) had received the grant of £6,500 and this together with funds already held had allowed the placement of an order for new equipment which should be installed by early May.

Mayor For Cornwall

b) The Councillors who had attended the public meeting at Liskeard, regarding the proposal for a Mayor for Cornwall, reported that the general feeling was that there should be a referendum on the decision. It was noted that the promised funds would be spread over 30 years. It seemed that further information was required.

Friends Of St Odulph's

c) Councillor Johnson reported that the friends of St Odulph's group had now been established formally, with officers and committee confirmed. The constitution is being drafted and that there was a groundswell of support from the Parish.

PLANNING APPLICATION None.

DEFIBRILLATOR

Because the battery of the defibrillator was near expiry the Council decided to purchase a replacement defibrillator at a net cost of £600 which would result in lower costs in future years.

FINANCE

The Council agreed the following payments; £180 to HMRC and £720 Clerk's salary.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Councillor Bunkum suggested the planting of a tree to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles in May. The Council agreed to consider the type of tree and its positioning.

The Clerk was asked to enquire if the tree could be planted on the highway verge. Councillor Johnson kindly offered to prepare and circulate a child safeguarding policy for review and adoption at the April Council meeting.

TAMAR TOLLS ACTION GROUP

Representatives of the Tamar Tolls Action Group gave a presentation, to the Council and an audience from the Village, explaining that the aims of the Group were to reduce or eliminate the Tamar Bridge tolls. Those attending the meeting were urged to contact County Councillors and Members of Parliament to support the aims of the Group.

CHANGES AHEAD FOR THE CHURCH

I don't know how many of you have read, or are even aware of, the deanery plan. As our churches struggle with dwindling numbers (Covid made a significant impact) and our income is reduced, we struggle. We struggle to keep church life going and we therefore are unable to support the five stipendiary clergy we have. The deanery (parishes between, and including, Callington and Torpoint will be cared for by just three clergy. The parishes are therefore being gathered into three groups; Calstock, St Dominick and St Mellion with Pillaton will join with the four parishes of the Callington cluster under one priest (Landulph will be joined with Saltash Area Ministry). There is a lot more than this to the plan and you can read it by following the link at the end of this article. I hope you will continue to support your parish church, whoever is providing pastoral care. It will continue with worship, mission, and ministry.

You may have heard that I am leaving the parishes* at Easter. I invite anyone who'd like to say goodbye (or ensure that I go!) to join me for a buffet lunch at St

Dominic village Hall at 12.00 on Palm Sunday (2 April). Come to the 10am service if you can. The pattern of worship on Sundays will continue. Please contact Wardens for details and send an email (we'll tell you where presently) for baptisms, weddings and funerals.

A reminder to you for your diaries. We continue to worship at St Odulph on the first and third Sundays every month. For Holy week and Easter - On Palm Sunday (2 April) in the past, we have walked through St Dominic, led by donkeys, and stopped at places to have a dramatic reading of the Easter story. Maundy Thursday remembers the Jewish Passover, the Last Supper and the Watch of the Passion. Holy Saturday (before Easter Day) sees a dramatic service of 'Easter Fire'. In the

darkness we hear God's promise of rescue, there's fire and candlelight and Easter is proclaimed in a blaze of light and glory. On Easter Sunday, the first light of Easter Day at sunrise heralds the Resurrection celebration as we gather at Halton Quay for worship at 6.35 (giving you a 25 minute lie in over last year!). Several churches in the benefice will hold a service on Easter Day, and we will continue to celebrate the Resurrection. See the website for details.

Above all, we are a people of hope, and we seek to service our community by being a beacon of light and new life for all.

Decorate the area with flags and bunting.



COMMEMORATION MOSAIC

A special service was held on 22nd January to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the lightning strike on the church tower of St Odulph's. A key part of the service involved the unveiling of a special commemorative mosaic plaque by the Right Reverend Hugh Nelson, Bishop of St. Germans. The mosaic (pictured right) was gifted to the church by members of the Pillaton Arts and Crafts Society, having been conceived and created by Richard Warwick, Captain of Bells at St Odulph's. Also involved with the project were Les Wyatt who produced the scaled up drawing for the design, Maire Warwick who assisted with the mosaic construction and Roger Warne who made the frame. 
