Away from Pillaton its hard to be optimistic about things, Gaza, Ukraine, immigration, protests, the economy and now a run of Government resignations and sackings over assorted misdemeanours.



Politicians getting into "difficulty" is not a new phenomenon, usually down to such things as expenses fiddles, tax avoidance and sexual impropriety. Sadly, it is something the public has almost come to expect. You only have to look back to the 1960s and the Profumo scandal. The one thing that has changed is the frequency, probably due to greater scrutiny through social media comment and 24 hour news reporting. No political party seems to have a monopoly over such indiscretions. I seem to remember the Lib Dems having an issue with one of the Cheeky Girls. The Tories have had their fair share of scandals over the years, John Major's affair with Edwina Curry, Neil Hamilton's 'cash for questions' libel case, various honourable members exposing themselves online in moments of madness, and of course Boris Johnson's choices over wallpaper and Partygate. Now the Labour party is coming up hard on the rails, with Peter Mandelson scoring a hat trick of career resignations/sackings and the loss of the deputy prime minister, amongst others. But, returning to a hopefully scandal free and more peaceful Pillaton, there are a number of events planned for this autumn. The Harvest Festival is on 6th October, followed by the annual Pumpkin Festival entering its twelfth year, at the end of the month. Cllr Dolley (Chair) welcomed everyone to the meeting.

## PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Mention was made that the Clapper Bridge coping stones had not been replaced. The Chairman advised that Cormac Highways were not responsible and that repairs may not take place until early 2026. Cornwall Cllr Gale advised that it is the 'Bridges' section of Cornwall Highways who are specifically tasked with carrying out the repairs in question.

The draft minutes of the Parish Council Meeting on 1 July 2025 were approved.

Cllr Gale gave a further update as follows:

Launceston minor injuries unit now open 4 days a week

Solar Farm consultation 126 hectares – consultation in progress.

Cornwall Independence – suggest that the matter goes to residents' Referendum. Blunts social/assisted housing scheme – under review but not suitable for the area.

Highways safety issues A390 – safety notices to be placed between Callington and Liskeard.

## **CHAIRMAN'S ITEMS**

Recreation Field Maintenance The Chairman) & Cllr Bridgman had attended to the repair and maintenance of the swing bolts and nuts. The play train will be decommissioned and removed. The slide is due for refurbishment. These action points will meet the requirements of the annual ROSPA report.

## **COUNCILLORS' REPORTS**

<u>Defibrillator</u> The Bleed kit used for demonstration purposes to be returned to Duchy Defibrillators.

Fly Tipping No further incidents.

<u>Playground Equipment</u> Cllr Johnson advised that a Quiz Night was planned for 6 September 2025 with funds raised going towards play equipment improvements. The Village Hall CIO Committee were willing to inject 50% match funding for the new goalposts costed at £400, with the other 50% to come from the Parish Council. Councillors agreed that the funds raised at the quiz night would be used to offset the goalposts costs.

Mention was made of a replacement play activity centre which would cost between £7,000 and £10,000. Cllr Johnson volunteered to look at funding streams in due course, following regenerating the joint Parish Council / Village Hall, but independent Playing Field Support Group (PFSG). The Village Hall CIO Committee appears mindful of contributing to the funding project with a view to a down payment being made to the (PFSG). All agreed with this action in principle.

<u>CyberCrime Awareness</u> A Cybercrime presentation by Devon & Cornwall Police to be held in the Village Hall is planned for 24 September.

Neighbourhood Priority Statement (NPS) Cllr Johnson advised that whilst the Parish Council may have no wish to further the Neighbourhood Development Plan, further consideration of the new policy may be necessary, and volunteered to attend the online presentation on the 30 September. The presentation would include an update on latest Planning changes, and Neighbourhood Planning generally which would include the latest on the (NPS) pilot scheme and how to get started.

## **CLERK'S ITEMS**

<u>Cornwall Association of Local Councils (CALC) Membership</u> Councillors discussed the merits of the annual membership subscription and agreed to consider subscribing from 1 April 2026, when the membership fee would have been budgeted for in the 2026/27 budget process. Councillors would also consider making a S.137 payment. The Parish Clerk to advise Cornwall ALC Limited.

<u>Website</u> The Parish Council agreed to renew Domain name.

<u>Draft Budget/Precept 2026/2027 (Review 7 October 2025)</u> Councillors noted.




# **CHRISTMAS TREE FESTIVAL 2025**

This year the Friends of St Odulph will be organising the Christmas Tree Festival to raise money for our village church.

The Grand Opening will be on **Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> December** between 3.30 and 5.30pm and will include mulled wine, mince pies and cake.



To be eco-friendly and imaginative the theme for this year will be:

Make do, Mend, Manufacture

Any group, family or individual can enter a Christmas Tree.

Trees can be made of anything reflecting the theme but should be in a recognisable tree shape, either two or three dimensional, hanging or free standing.

Maximum size 6' tall and 2.6' wide (1.8m x 0.7m). There is no minimum size and little trees are welcome.

Any lights used must be battery operated as there are few power points in the church. Timers would be useful.



Please do not include decorations of monetary or sentimental value as the church is open during daylight hours and the display will not be stewarded.

# HOWTON SOLAR FARM FUND 12 YEARS OF GIVING

Since 2013, the Howton Solar Farm Fund has distributed over £395,000 to 105 community projects in Pillaton, Landrake & St Erney, St Mellion, St Dominick and Saltash. These projects have reached 29,658 people over this period.

The fund balances immediate community needs with long-term sustainability, creating lasting infrastructure improvements whilst addressing social isolation, youth development, and environmental consciousness. Strong community engagement, volunteer involvement, and local fundraising contributions ensured sustainable impact across diverse demographic groups throughout the region.

- Community facilities were improved with 67 awards. Multiple village halls received critical support for roof replacements, accessibility improvements, and energy-efficient upgrades including solar panels and battery storage systems.
- Youth projects were supported through improved outdoor learning spaces, recording studios, wildlife monitoring systems, and skills development programmes.
- **Health and wellbeing** projects addressed rural isolation challenges through telephone befriending services, dementia-friendly nature hubs, and community counselling provision.
- **Heritage and culture** projects preserved local history through various commemorative projects engaging thousands of participants. Cultural events, including VE Day celebrations and community arts programmes, strengthened social cohesion.
- Environmental conservation featured prominently with biodiversity projects, community gardens, and habitat monitoring programmes engaging young people in conservation activities.

Examples of the grants awarded include the Tamar Canoe Association (3 awards totalling £12,150 since 2017), St Dominic Community Shop (3 awards totalling £13,300 since 2020), The Core Youth and Community Centre in Saltash (5 awards totalling £15,790 since 2016) and the Livewire Youth Project (5 awards totalling £26,349 since 2013). Closer to home the Pillaton and St Mellion Handbell Ringers, Pillaton Arts and Crafts Society, Pillaton Playing Field Support Group, Pillaton Village Hall Committee, Pillaton World War One, Commemoration Group. St Mellion C of E Primary School, St. Mellion with Pillaton Parochial Church Council have all received grants over the last 12 years.

**Background of the fund:** The Howton Solar Farm Fund was initiated in July 2011 under the kind direction of John and Jacqueline Moss of Howton Farm. The Fund was set up when creating a solar farm on the land at Howton Farm, which is currently run in partnership with Lightsource BP. The fund supports projects within a 6-mile radius of the farm and was created to benefit the local community.

Cornwall Community Foundation accepts applications for the fund which are then reviewed by a local decision making panel. The panel is made up of five locals, Dave Dolley Chairman, Roger Warne, Paul Holt, Graham Moore, Raymond Mingo, three of whom have sat on the panel since the very beginning. They are keen to see the local community thrive and understand the importance of creating a positive environment for all living in the area. John Moss has said, "We are very proud and have a sense of satisfaction of this fund's achievements."

**Fund criteria:** Supporting community projects in the areas of Pillaton, Landrake & St Erney, St Mellion, St Dominick and Saltash. Projects with an educational element or awareness of reducing their carbon footprint may be given priority.

You must spend your grant on improving the sustainability and/or carbon footprint of your organisation or the community. Projects including an educational element will be looked upon favourably. Your project must be completed within one year of the grant offer unless agreed otherwise. This fund will not fund restoration works to any Churches or wages. The average grant is £1,000 - £5,000 although on occasion more may be granted.
