After such poor weather for most of the summer, early September has been unusually hot and humid, particularly so for Cornwall. Apparently, weather patterns coming up from the Sahara were to blame, which was all made very noticeable one morning by the extensive polka dot pattern of dust spots left on my car following a brief shower of rain. For some the hot weather will have been bliss, but for others not so with the sticky nights making it difficult to sleep.

Still complaining about things, notably the weather, is a peculiarly British obsession and reflected by what appears in our press. This summer has seen an endless succession of concerning stories from blighted holidays, wildfires, air traffic chaos, rail strikes to the cost-of-living crisis. There must be some good news somewhere.

Even the most successful Women's World Cup in history was completely overshadowed by just one thing- an ill-judged kiss. Clearly the Spanish authorities have issues to resolve, but surely the tournament should be most remembered for the fact that Spain became first-time winner, outplaying a plucky England team in an exciting final, rather than anything else. Just imagine if the most notable thing about the 1966 World Cup Final were the implications for NHS dentistry, due to Nobby Stiles not wearing his false teeth when Her Majesty the Queen presented him with his World Cup winners medal.

I suppose it's just a sad fact of life that bad news or controversy sells newspapers and improves viewer numbers, so we should just come to expect it.

Of course, the latest big issue of concern in the country has been the widespread use in schools and public buildings of a special aerated type of concrete that has an unfortunate tendency to crumble with age. This lightweight material started out life in the 1920s, in Sweden, and was later transformed for roofing purposes with the addition of reinforcing metal bars to become the reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete (RAAC), that we have all been hearing about. However, unlike most things Swedish, such as Volvo cars and Abba, RAAC is proving not to be nearly as durable, particularly if roofs were not kept well maintained and waterproofed, causing fears that some buildings may be in danger of imminent collapse. However, one tiny crumb of comfort, for once the RAAC problem is not a uniquely British one. The material has been used extensively around the world since the 1950s, so many other countries are going to be in the same boat.

So, to use the old Crimewatch catchphrase, 'Don't have nightmares, do sleep well.' You can rest assured it will soon be too wet and cold, and I will try and not print too many negative stories.

MINUTES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 5 SEPTEMBER 2023

<u>PUBLIC FORUM</u> There were 4 members of the public present.

MINUTES

The minutes of the 4th July 2023 Council meeting were accepted unanimously.

PUBLIC FORUM

Mr. Smith told the Parish Council that some of the trees in St. Odulph's churchyard required significant lopping of branches or indeed felling although this would be sometime in the future. The Church PCC realized that the work could significantly affect the view and accordingly invited the Parish Council to be involved. The Chair and Cllr. Johnson agreed to liaise with the Church authorities.

MATTERS ARISING

a. Telephone Box Painting

The Chairman reported that he had been unable to contact the previous contractor and hence the Council agreed to approach a new contractor.

b. <u>Installation Of Speed Camera</u>

Cllr. Johnson informed the Council that the Police would not support a speed camera because there had been no reported accidents in the Village, however Cornwall Highways were studying alternatives. Cllr. Johnson said that the Police would support the setting up of a speed watch group with hand held cameras and that he would continue to enquire into the possibilities.

c. Overgrown Verge Next To Dolcoath

The Chairman thanked Cllr. Johnson for cutting the grass on the verge next to Dolcoath. It was noted that the grass cutting and the planting of a tree were completely separate matters.

d. Overgrown Vegetation At Tiddlers Well

The Chairman informed the Council that owners of the trees in the lane were examining the tree heights and that Mr Rubie had kindly cut back the hedge on the corner.

The Council approved the following applications:

PA23/05860 Construction of a balcony and external window alterations, internal alterations, glazed garden room and replacement garage at the Old Barn Polborder for Mrs Zimmer.

PA23/06551Modification of a planning obligation to remove a small parcel of land from deed in respect of application E2/00/01369/OUT for Coombe Farm.

The Council asked for volunteers to administer the library.

The Council agreed to write to the occupier and request removal of the abandoned furniture in the lay by.

FINANCE

The Council approved the payment of £47 to Handmadepages for web site hosting and domain name renewal.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

The Council agreed that they would not comment on matters raised on Facebook but would welcome and respond to correspondence addressed to the Council.

It was noted that Mr Renfree would remove the fly tipping from the river.

The Chairman confirmed that the equipment in the playing field was clear of faults. *Chairman Mr. Dolley*

After putting up a few posters and making an announcement on the village Facebook page the news spread and I had many positive responses from friends and neighbours offering to make cakes, donate raffle prizes or simply just come along and support the cause. Mentioning it to the Pillaton and St Mellion Handbell ringers at our weekly Wednesday afternoon practice, they thought it would be a good idea to include a short recital to entertain everyone while they enjoyed their tea. I began to worry that maybe there would not be enough cake so started to fill the freezer with batches of scones and other bakes.

On the morning of the tea, together with John and Jenny Wheeley, we prepared the hall setting out the tables and chairs, hoping that there would be enough people to fill them. We needn't have worried as by 2.30 there was a queue to come in and the raffle tickets were selling fast. Fortunately, the weather stayed fine so that the picnic benches were available to take the overflow. Gallons of tea were poured out, masses of cake consumed, although there was still enough left over for people to take home some slices to be enjoyed later. The handbell ringers provided some uplifting music, and several lucky people went home with some good raffle prizes.

All in all, a very convivial and enjoyable afternoon and after counting the proceeds I was able to send £600 to Breast Cancer Now.

#### PILLATON VILLAGE HALL CIO BOOKING SECRETARY

Pillaton Village Hall is managed by a Registered Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) set up in 2017, enabling Trustees to feel safe knowing they bear no personal financial liability. The CIO is seeking a new trustee who will also assume the position of Booking Secretary. The appointment is ex officio meaning the holder maintains the role on a permanent basis and does not have to seek reappointment as a trustee every 3 years.

The position entails the following responsibilities:

- 1. Management of all bookings for the Village Hall, which includes ensuring vetting of hirers and their compliance with CIO terms and conditions.
- 2. Checking status of hall after booking and advising treasurer on refund of deposit if damage incurred.

The booking process has been simplified recently with the implementation of an online booking system, which significantly reduces the effort involved and can be viewed at <a href="https://hallbookingonline.com/pillaton/">https://hallbookingonline.com/pillaton/</a>


