The weather in Pillaton during the early part of November seems to have been remarkably settled and quiet. Something that can't be said for the rest of the world with devastating floods in Spain, war in the Middle East and Ukraine and a new President on his way to the White House who has promised to shake up things both domestically in the US and on the international stage. With Donald Trump at the helm, we could be in for a very scary rollercoaster ride on the economic front, but you never know some decisive action and unpredictability on his part might actually resolve some world conflicts. #### PILLATON PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 22 OCTOBER 2024

<u>PRESENT</u> Councillor Dolley (Chairman) Councillors: Bunkum, Floyd, Johnson, Moore & Warne (Vice Chair) Also in attendance: Christopher Cook - Parish Clerk & Responsible Financial Officer (RFO).

<u>PUBLIC PARTICIPATION</u> Three members of the public were present.

APOLOGIES Cllr Ley.

<u>DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST</u> None.

#### **MINUTES**

The draft minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 3 Sep 2024 were approved.

MATTERS ARISING None.

#### **PLANNING**

Two planning applications were received after the meeting agenda issued:

<u>PA24/07897</u> Single storey rear extension at Briston Orchard Barn, St Mellion. Councillors supported proposal considering development to be modest and acceptable.

<u>PA24/07985</u> Coombe Mill Farm, Pillatonmill - Application for a Lawful Development Certificate for an Existing use non-compliance with agricultural occupancy condition contained within condition 15 of approval 02/00380/FUL dated 31.10.2002 has occurred for over 10 years.

Councillors supported proposal, noting location had not been used for agricultural use for at least 10 years by the current residents and the dwelling was used for residential use with no expectation of change. Councillors considered this was acceptable whilst noting previous agricultural ties to the land, and previous support for the original Planning Application.

#### **FINANCE**

<u>Payments</u> The Council approved the following payments: Clerk's salary £150; Village Hall £20.

#### Budget & Precept Setting 2025/26

The proposed draft Budget and Precept for 2025/26 were discussed noting that the cost of Local Elections on 1 May 2025 was unknown at this stage. Consideration of the likely effect on the Band 'D' rating for Precept purposes will be considered in November when the Cornwall Council Tax Base amount is released for 2025/26.

A draft Budget level of £5,000 for 2025/26 was proposed and agreed by councillors (an increase on 2024/25 but bringing the level of Precept in line with that of 2023/24 set at £4,625).

A draft Precept amount of £5,000 for 2025/26 was proposed and agreed by councillors (an increase of approximately 35% on the 2024/25 Precept set at £3,727, and necessary to meet Budget requirements for 2025/26).

The draft Budget and Precept figures will be finalised at the November meeting.

#### CHAIRMAN'S ITEMS

The Chairman advised councillors about on-going maintenance work in the Playing Field to the Shelter post, and the zip wire mechanism had been strengthened. Equipment displaying rust fatigue would be treated to ensure that the equipment remained in use and safe.

The Chairman and councillors also offered thanks to Gary Bridgman for trimming and cutting hedges in the playing field, at no expense to the Parish Council.

#### PARISH CLERK'S ITEMS

<u>Car Parking At Mary Moon Close</u> A response has been received from Cornwall Housing confirming it is responsible for the parking area. However, any parking improvements need to be funded from their capital budgets, and for the next two financial years, Cornwall Housing is focussing expenditure on its properties to bring them up to the decent homes standard. There is therefore little likelihood of funds being made available to provide additional parking.

<u>Village Milestone Maintenance</u> The Clerk advised the Council is entitled to renovate and repaint milestones without further reference to Heritage England and this is permissible if the milestone has been painted in the past. The Chairman stated that the milestone in question at Darkey Lane was quite deteriorated and difficult to read. Cllr Warne suggested that by using a suitable drill bit on the granite the wording to locations could be reproduced to good effect.

#### VILLAGE WEBSITE

The new website is expected to be fully operational from early November 2024. Cllr Ley has settled the new annual maintenance fee £129.60 with Wix, and also paid £20 to Handmadepages to transfer the Pillaton domain name administration to Patrick McClaughry (Wix). Cllr Ley to be reimbursed in full.

#### DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING

Cllr Warne (Vice Chair) advised that a successful training session had been provided at a cost of £108. He also advised that 'Bleed Kits' were now available, and each defibrillator cabinet would include a 'Bleed Kit' in due course; delivery details awaited. Cllr Warne was thanked for arranging the training session.

#### **COUNCILLORS' REPORTS**

Noticeboard Repairs The Chairman offered thanks to Cllrs Warne & Bunkum for their advice in effecting repairs to the Council noticeboard posts which were rotting at the base. Cllr Warne has also successfully inserted wedges to strengthen the posts.

<u>Road Closures</u> Cllr Bunkum updated Councillors concerning the forthcoming road closures in and around Pound Hill, Landrake resulting from water and sewerage works to be carried out at Dolbeare from early November 2024. The Clerk will take action to circulate details.

Cllr Johnson has updated the Facebook page with details of the Saltash Tunnel redevelopment works.

#### PILLATON PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 5 NOVEMBER 2024

#### **MINUTES**

The draft minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 22 Oct 2024 were approved.

MATTERS ARISING None.

#### **PLANNING**

No new planning applications or decisions received since last meeting.

#### **FINANCE**

<u>Payments</u> The Council approved the following payments: Clerk's salary £150; Reimbursed to Cllr Ley, Wix website annual fee £129.60 and Domain name transfer to Wix £20.

Two other invoices were presented at the meeting- Mr R Hoskin for strimming at Pillaton Playing Field £300 and Dr S McClaughry for Remembrance Day wreath £20. Cllrs approved both amounts to be settled under delegatory powers by RFO.

#### **BUDGET & PRECEPT SETTING 2025/26**

Cllrs formally approved the motion to set the Budget and Precept levels both at £5,000 for 2025 / 2026.

#### **CHAIRMAN'S ITEMS**

The Chairman advised councillors there was on-going maintenance work in the Playing Field to the Shelter posts as they were continuing to rot. Remedial repair work could include resetting the posts using metal plates to keep the posts away from ground level. The floor to the play train was now very deteriorated and the equipment should be removed from service imminently (during the winter months). The junior play equipment stainless steel springs require refixing.

Cllr Johnson suggested that the Play Equipment funding group should be reformed to discuss the possibility of grant funding for new playground equipment, and consideration be given to apply for a grant from the Solar Farm project. Councillors agreed with this proposal.

#### PARISH CLERK'S ITEMS

<u>Fly tipping</u> Cllrs were informed a recent fly-tipping incident at the St.Mellion roundabout is a matter for St. Mellion Parish Council to resolve.

#### **VILLAGE WEBSITE**

The new website is now live with a new website address of www.pillaton.org although users should be automatically re-directed if the old website address is

inadvertently used. The Parish Council will need to pay a small fee in November 2025 to renew the annual domain name with the service provider Wix.

The Council formally recorded thanks and appreciation to Mr Patrick McClaughry for the considerable time and effort he has given to successfully develop the new Village website, ably supported by Mr John Wheeley, and Cllr Chris Ley.

#### DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING


There remains one outstanding invoice for the recent training session. Cllrs were also advised that Annette Rickard, based at the trauma centre Derriford Hospital, was willing to provide some additional training in respect to First Aid and (CPR).

#### COUNCILLORS' REPORTS

<u>Clapper Bridge</u> Cllr Warne mentioned the difficulty in achieving repair work to the Clapper Bridge. This item was on-going for monitoring.

<u>Road Closures</u> Cllr Bunkum advised that the road closure was now in place in respect to closures in and around Pound Hill, Landrake resulting from water and sewerage works being carried out at Dolbeare during early November 2024.



As announced in September's edition, the village has a new website, which is now up and running. The new website address is, **www.pillaton.org** rather than **www.pillaton.org.uk**, although the old address may continue to work for a while on some browsers.


The new site looks different to the old one, but its structure is the same, so it should be just as easy to navigate. Since going live one technical glitch seems to have arisen for users of Norton Anti-Virus, which seems to want to flag the new website, pillaton.org, as being unsafe. However, all the other main anti-virus providers including Windows Defender and McAfee think it's fine. More specifically, the issue only exists if you have Norton Safeweb installed, and this can be disabled temporarily through the 'manage extensions' setting on your internet browser. The issue has been raised with Norton and will hopefully be resolved in due course.



#### How to book a slot

You can book a 30-minute slot on the Cornwall Council website or by calling 0300 1234 141.

You can book for the same day, if there are spaces available, or up to a week in advance. Once you've booked your slot, you'll receive an email confirming your booking.

Make sure you arrive in the vehicle you booked for and remember you need a vehicle permit to enter the sites for certain vehicles, such as vans or pick-up trucks. You can check what vehicles need a permit to visit the HWRCs on the Cornwall Council website.

You cannot use the HWRCs to dispose of any trade or commercial waste.

For Pillaton, the collections due on Wednesdays over the Christmas and New Year period have been changed as follows:

Due **Christmas Day**, Food and Rubbish collection, changed to *Friday 27 December* 

Due **New Year's Day**, Food and Recycling collection, changed to *Thursday 2 January* 



Due to Christmas, if households have more food waste than will fit in their outdoor caddy, they can put it out for collection in a compostable liner on top of their outdoor caddy.

#### SALTASH TUNNEL

As readers of the Village News will be aware National Highways (NH) is undertaking a £25 million major upgrade of the A38 Saltash Tunnel, with the aim of maintaining the safe operation of the tunnel, providing more reliable journeys for motorists, and reducing the risk of unplanned closures in the future.



#### **Postponement of Major Works**

A recent update on the work provided by NH last month reported there has now been a postponement of the commencement of the major civil engineering work from November 2024 until next year. This has been due to the complexity of the scheme and the need to finalise some of the commercial and programming decisions.

#### **Revised Dates**

For the major civil works, the new proposed dates are as follows:

#### Early 2025 to late 2025

The tunnel will be closed in both directions on weeknights with traffic using local diversion routes. By closing the tunnel only at night, this should reduce the impact on the local community and drivers.

During this period, for a time, one lane will be narrowed on the eastern approach to the Tamar Bridge.

#### Summer 2025 for 5 months

'The Switch-off'. The tunnel and bridge will no longer operate on a tidal flow basis. Fixed lanes will be in operation with clear directions for each lane, until work is complete.

#### Night-time Closures - Preparatory Works

Prior to the start of the major work NH will continue with its preparatory work on the tunnel. This includes removal of old cabling from tunnel ducts, cleaning, jetting, and re-roping the cable ducts, removal of cladding panels to survey for the new tunnel gantries and installation of new fibre optics under the Tamar Bridge. Most of this preparatory work can be completed with the tunnel open for traffic, but there will be some requirement for night-time tunnel closures. Advance notice of these closures will be announced as dates are confirmed.

#### LANDRAKE

The road closure from Blunts to Pound Hill, Landrake and access to the A38, is due to remain in force until Friday13 December whilst sewage and water works are undertaken around Dolbeare.


